1)	It will rejuvenate the Village Centre making Balrothery a more attractive place to live and work and will increase its tourism potential.

- 6) The design of the regeneration of the public areas has been carried out in line with a number of recommendations made in the document entitled – Design Manual for urban roads and Streets (DMURS) published by the Deoartment of Transport, Tourism and Sport.
- 7) This project also displays the following criteria which are considered 'high priority'
 - a) Enhancement of Heritage and /or other community assets. Balrothery Heritage centre is accessed via fair green and currently has no available parking spaces and no continuous path from the village. This project will enhance the Heritage area by making access easier and also by introducing a new footpath and parking spaces along the existing mucky strip that exists where the fair green meets the roadway. There are also times wen cars will drive onto the green and leave tyre marks behind especially in winter months.
 - b) Town Safety and accessibility enhancements.- There is no pedestrian crossing point within the village at the moment and an ever-increasing number of people go to and from the shops on a daily basis and have to J-walk or run to cross the roads. This is particularly difficult for wheelchair users. This project will provide 5 crossing points 4 onto the commercial island and 1 onto fair green /Heritage centre.
- 8) This project also displays the following criteria which are considered 'low priority'
 - a) Enhancement of streetscape and town environment
 - b) Car-parking improvements.

The principals behind these projects were also highlighted by the Community when asked what they felt needs the most attention and what problems people were experiencing when living in Balrothery. The design proposal was put together following this survey and is an example of a public-led design process. These projects have also been discussed with the Operations Department of Fingal County Council whom agree that they are worthwhile and important projects and have endeavoured to assist in their delivery over the next 12 months.

However although not within the funding bracket it should still be stated that this project will allow local residents to walk to the village centre and not worry about getting across the road safely and it will also allow visitors to Balrothery to park their cars in designated public car-parking places and to walk around and explore and hopefully stay for a while and support the local economy.

There is a large number of tourists passing through Balrothery on a daily basis but especially at weekends as Balrothery is on the main route to nearby Ardgillan Park from the M1. At the moment there is only private car-parking spaces available and this project will include the introduction of 37no public car-parking spaces. As well as 5 speedramps which double up as pedestrian crossing points be that , zebra crossings or fully signalled lights. There is also 2no. loading bays for local businesses which will be welcomed by all but especially by the commercial vehicle drivers supplying the local businesses.

Objective 1:- Improve town Safety and Accessibility

Objective 2:- Increase Economic benefit to the area

Outcomes / benchmarks :-

The desired outcome of this project would be to improve day-to-day accessibility for pedestrians in Balrothery and to set a good lasting impression on anybody who enters Balrothery and make them feel like they should stop and look around. It will complement renewal works already completed i.e traditional stone walls which effectively portray Heritage and History.

Another successful outcome would be a safer village with people able to cross from surrounding residential areas to the commercial island. (no pedestrian crossing in Balrothery at present)
